THE ADAMS FAMILY

Authentic Adams Family records date from A.D. 871 down through feats of battle and statesmanship, early settling in America, with records of 1338 Adams Revolutionary Veterans, of Adams poetry, bibliography, etc., all data guaranteed.

The family of Adams or Adam (meaning red-Adamah or red earth) can claim the distinction of having the oldest individual name on record. The surnames of modern times are said to have originated during the Crusades in Palestine, the baptismal name alone having been before that time in common use among Christians. The chieftain of the crusading expeditions then assumed the names of the places whence they came or of the estates of which they are owners.

The common soldiers added the Christian names, and hence the surname of Christian names with the addition of son, in Scotch MacAdam. The single letter s added to the baptismal name was only a variety and abridgment of the same mark of filiation and hence the surname compounded of Christian names with the s are also abundant. The artificers frequently assumed the name of their trades, which passed to their children and descended to their posterity.

Among the most conspicuous of the Adams family who migrated to America, were Henry, of Braintree, Mass., and Robert of Ipswich, Mass., both of whom it is said were descended from Lord John Ap Adam, son of Ap Adam, who came out of the Marches of Wales.

There is scarcely a county in England or Wales where the name of Adams is not found. There were other emigrants of the Adams family to America whose origin is not definitely known.

Thomas Adams, brother of Henry, of Braintree, Mass. was one of the grantees named in the charter of Charles I, 1629. He was at different times Alderman, High Sheriff and Lord Mayor of London. The names of Alexander, Charles, Chraisto-pher, Fernandini, Jeremy, Nathanial, Philip, and Richard Adams are mentioned in Farmers Register as among the earliest settlers of Massachusetts.

The earliest record of the English branch of the Adams family is that of John Ap Adam, of Charlton Adam, in Somersetshire, who married Elizabeth, daughter of and heiress to John, Lord Gourny, Haviston and Tidenham, county of Gloucester, who was summoned to Parliament as Baron of the Realm 1296 to 1307.

In the upper part of a Gothic window on the southeast side of Tidenham church near Chopston, the name of Johes Ab Adam, 1310, and Arms, Argent on a cress gules five mullets or, of Lord Ap Adam are still to be found beautifully executed in stained glass of great thickness and in perfect preservation.

The Arms and Crest borne by the family are described as: ARMS, Argent on a cross gules, five mullets or, Crest, out of a ducal coronet a demi lion. Motto, Loyal au Mort.

Ap Adam (I) came out of the Marches of Wales, Lords of the March were noblemen, who in the early ages inhabited and secured, the Marches of Wales and Scotland, ruling as if they were petty kings with their private laws, these were subsequently abolished.

ROBERT (15) supposed to be the immediate progenitor of Robert, settled in Newburyport, Mass, 1640.

HENRY (16) of Braintree, Mass. emigrated to New England in 1630, in the ship Fortune, and in Feb. 1641 was granted 40 acres of land by Boston, which Braintree was a part. He brought with him eight sons, and was the great-great grandfather of John Adams, second president of the United States, who at Braintree (words "was buried" probably were omitted here by Iva accidentally--AMcD) with the following inscription:

"In memory of Henry Adams, who took his flight from the

Dragon of persecution in Devonshire, England and lighted with eight sons near Mount Wallaston. One of the sons returned to England and after taking time to explore the country, four moved to Medfield and neighboring towns, two to Chelmsford.

"Only one, Joseph (who lies here at his left hand) remained here, who was an original proprietor in the township of Braintree 1639.

"This stone and several others have been placed in this yard by a great-grandson from veneration of the piety, humility and sympathy, prudence, patience, temperance, frugality, industry, and perseverance of his ancestors, in hope of recommending an emulation of their virtues to their posterity."

The children of Henry of Braintree were:

1. HENRY, born 1604, settled at Medfield, Mass. 2. THOMAS, born in England 1612, settled at Chelmsford, Mass. 3. SAMUEL, born 1617, settled at Chelmsford, Mass., died 1666. 4. JONA-THAN, born 1619, settled at Medfield, married (1) Elizabeth, (2) Mary. 5. PETER, born 1632 (this figure probably should be 1622--AMCD), settled at Medfield. 6. JOHN, born 1624, settled at Concord, afterwards West Cambridge. 7. JOSEPH of Braintree, born 1626, freman (freeman-?) 1655, Dec. 1694. His monument is at Quincy in the family burial place and is that referred to in the inscription on his father's tombstone (who lies here at the left hand). 8. EDWARD, born 1630, settled at Medfield, died 1716. 9.URSULA, married in her father's will.

HENRY, son of Henry of Braintree, had five sons from which the family of President John Adams, our family and others descended. President Roosevelt's mother descended from the family of Joseph.

Our family left Massachusetts in 1770 in the person of Gilbert Adams who migrated to Dutchess County, New York.

GILBERT ADAMS served in the French and Indian War, also in the Revolutionary War under Washington. Died Sept. 1826.

PHILIP ADAMS, son of Gilbert, was born Oct. 1776 in Dutchess County, New York, and migrated to Ohio in the fall of 1824 and settled in Warren County near Cincinnati, where he lived until Dec. 1832, when he moved to Miami County near Pique (this may be Piqua--AMcD). He died in 1875 leaving his

wife, Pheba, who lived to be about 90 years old. Their children were Sarles Travers, Gilbert, Clarke, John Quincy, Daniel, Martha, Eliza, Jane, Sarah.

SARLES TRAVERS ADAMS was born in Dutchess County, New York, May 21, 1812. He purchased land in Miami Co. (Ohio) in 1825. In 1856, sold and purchased near Troy, Miami Co., then sold and purchased land west of Pique in Dark Co. Married Mary Harrison in 1832, daughter of Richard Harrison whose father was brother of William Henry Harrison, President of the United States. All of their children were born in Miami Co. In 1866 in May, the family migrated to Wisconsin, St. Croix Co. is, all of the children except the four youngest. Nov. 23, 1866 he and his wife and four youngest children arrived in Wis. and settled in Springfield Township, where the town of Hersey was founded and where he manufactured lumber and purchased land. There were eleven children, nine lived to old age and all purchased land in Wis. The children were: (Richard, Albert, John, Mary, Jane, Hannah and Pheba twins, David, Ida, Reuben, Sina, Died in 1883.

RICHARD ADAMS was born in Ohio on July 17, 1833. Served with the Ohio Infantry in the Civil War. Married Eliza Max-well Johnston and later migrated to St. Croix Co., Wis., where he lived most of his life. Was postmaster for years at Hersey in the same county. Seven children were born to them: Lewis Harrison, born Dec. 5, 1857, died Aug. 10, 1858 in Ohio. Rollen Ellis, born Jan. 26, 1865, died Oct. 8, 1877 in Wis. Nancy and Minnie died when little girls in Wis. Three children lived to old age: Thomas Andrew, Mary Francis, Lawrence Albert. He married Mrs. Myra Barney late in life and stayed in Hersey for a while then went to Wapaca, Wis., where his wife died. He then went to Minneapolis, Minn. to the home of his son Thomas, where he lived just two days, dying suddenly at the age of 79.

ALBERT ADAMS lived in St. Croix Co. on land he purchased when the family migrated to the state of Wis. He married Martha Jane McDowell who died many years before his death. He was a successful farmer and lived on his land most of his life near Hersey, Wis. except for a few years he lived in Battle Creek, Mich. There were two children who married and he lived to see his grandchildren. His children were: Anderson, Annabelle.

JOHN ADAMS was born in Ohio and died as the result of service in the Civil War. Was married, had two children.

MARY, oldest daughter of Sarles, married Thomas Ross in Ohio and came to Wis., when her father did and purchased land in St. Croix Co. near Hersey, Wis. They had one son, David. She was born 1842, died 1899.

JANE, married William Randolph, a miller and farmer in Ohio and came to Wis. and purchased land near Hersey where she lived until her death. She was born 1844, died 1881. Six children were born to them: Charles, Rose, Roland, Mamie,

Sina, Raymond (died in infancy).

HANNAH (her twin PHEBA died) married Frank Linton in Ohio and came to Wisconsin and purchased land near Hersey, where she lived neighbors to her sister Mary. No children were born to them but they adopted three, who were Charles and Nettie Kay and Stella Linton. She died when 80 years of age.

DAVID ADAMS was born in Ohio and came to Wisconsin and settled in St. Croix Co. Married Aliza Peck in Wis. who died many years before his death. He lived in St. Croix Co. until his late years then went back to Ohio and married a childhood sweetheart and lived there the remaining years of his life. Three children were born of the first marriage: Grace, Delta, Bert (deceased).

IDA, fourth daughter of Sarles, came to Wis. with her parents and married L. Curtis, associated with her father in manufacturing lumber. Lived in Hersey, Wis. then late in life she married again to a man surnamed Reck from Ohio and went back there to live the rest of her days, A son was born to the first marriage: Clinton.

REUBEN ADAMS, youngest son of Sarles went to Wisconsin with his father and lived in Hersey, St. Croix Co. where he married Hallie Erb, 1875. Lived there many years then went to Minneapolis, Minn. He worked in the office of the Red River Lumber Co. and was for many years curator of the Walker Art Gallery, doing much research and cataloging. He was also Market master in that city. Was born Nov. 1853 and died 1935. Four children were born to them: Rennie, Lily, Innes, Walter.

SINA, youngest daughter of Sarles, born in Ohio, went to Wis. when her father did and married Rev. WallaceHopkins who conducted the church in Hersey for some years, then went to St. Louis, Missouri. He was co-inventor of the Moon-Hopkins office machine. She died in St. Louis, leaving five children: Addie, William, Nellie, Ethel, Minnie.

The children of Richard:

THOMAS ANDREW ADAMS, born in Ohio, Miami Co., Dec. 23, 1855 and went to St. Croix Co., Wis. when a boy. Lived in Hersey until his marriage to Marinda DeVore, July 1877 and moved on land given to his bride by her father in Springfield Township, then went to Wildwood in the same county where the family lived for twelve years, then went to Glenwood, to Washburn, to Iron River, all in Wis. Went to Minneapolis, Minn. in the fall of 1905, where he resided until his death on Dec. 9, 1932. His wife died suddenly the same week, both at the age of 77. He was an engineer all of his life. Four children were born to them: Iva Dell, Herschel David, Elsie, Bytha.

MARY FRANCIS, born in Ohio Feb. 15, 1859, went to Wis. with her parents and grew to womanhood in Hersey where she married Cicero DeVore in 1877 later going to land given to him by his father in Springfield Township. Lived in Wilson,

Wis. then went back to their farm. Went to St. Louis Park, Minn., suburb of Minneapolis. After their children married, they went to Seattle, Wash. where they both died. Eight children were born to them: Trevanian, Ray, Earl, Charles (deceased), Clarence, Flossie, Norman, Lillian.

LAWRENCE ALBERT ADAMS, born in Ohio, Mar. 16, 1867 in Miami Co. (Ohio). Came to Wis. with his parents and spent boyhood in Hersey. Married Elizabeth Nesbitt in Minnesota, went to Wildwood, Wis. for a while, then to Chippewa Falls, Wis. to live; later went to Iron River, Wis., then to Hibbing, Minn., where he reared his family and where his wife died. He spent a few years in Kentucky but returned to Hibbing. Engineering was his vocation which he followed most of his life. He now resides in Hibbing in his old age, now 77. Four children were born to them: Maude, Ralph Roland, Violet (deceased), Essie.

ANDERSON ADAMS, only son of Albert, lived in St. Croix Co. while young. Then went to Battle Creek, Mich. Three daughters were born to the first marriage: Edna, Olive and another whose name have not learned. Edna and Olive are married and live in California.

ANNABELLE, only daughter, married Oliver Dickens and lived in Dexter, Minn. where her husband was in business and where their only child was born. She died many years ago and her husband came to Minneapolis, Minn. to live with the daughter, Hazel.

The child of Mary:

DAVID, grew to manhood in St. Croix County, Wis.

Hannah had no children of her own, but adopted three: Charles Linton livesin Minneapolis, is married and has no children. Nettie lives in Oregon and has a family. Stella lives in Oregon, after being in Oakland, California for a few years. Stell has one son, Frank, now a young man, by a former marriage.

The children of Jane:

CHARLES, married, his wife's name was Goldsmith, lives in Hersey, Wis., where he reared his family and now resides in his old age.

ROSE grew to womanhood and spent most of her life in Wis. Later went west and married a man surnamed Shafer. Died in a western state. SINA lived in a western state, married.

ROLAND, MAMIE, RAYMOND (deceased).

The children of David:

GRACE and DELTA grew to womanhood in Wilson, Wis., St. Croix Co.

BERT died in Wisconsin.

The child of Ida:

CLINTON grew to manhood in St. Croix Co. and spent most of his life in Wisconsin.

The children of Reuben:

RENNIE ADAMS was born in 1876 in Hersey, St. Croix Co., Wis. Spent boyhood there, then went to Minneapolis with his parents and started in business for himself, owning a mechanical shop for years, until his death. He made equipment and apparatus for the stage and knew many who were prominent in stage acting. Houdini was among those for whom he made apparatus. He married but his wife died years before his own death. Died April 22, 1943. No children.

LILY, born Nov. 6, 1877 in Hersey, Wis. and went to Minneapolis with her parents as a girl, where later she married Charles Greening who died quite young. She devoted part of her time to oil painting, having talent for art. She lived with her parents until their deaths and now has the family home in Minneapolis. There was one child who died in infancy.

INNES ADAMS, born in Minneapolis and spent all his life there. He graduated from High School and attended the Minn. University. Married Nella Pyatt and lived in the city until his death at 35 years of age. Two children were born to them: Marilyn, Innes, Jr.

WALTER ADAMS, born in Minneapolis and spent all his life there. He served in World War I in the United StatesArmy. He was very talented in acrobatic tumbling, having done some stage work. He died suddenly three weeks before his brother, Rennie, on April 1, 1943. Born Aug. 5, 1892.

The children of Sina:

ADDIE, born in St. Louis, Mo., the oldest child, educated in that city and married. Lives there now.

WILLIAM, born in St. Louis, and resides there.

NELLIE, born in St. Louis and was doing welfare work for the Board of Education.

Taught school then went to Minneapolis and married Chester A. Holcombe, a minister's son, and sent to Seattle, Wash. Seven children were born to them: Willard, Gilbert, Chester (deceased), Marjorie, Theadore, Elsie, Genivieve.

BYTHA, born in Wildwood, Wis., Jan. 24, 1890. Spent childhood in Wildwood, Glenwood, Iron River, Wisconsin, went to Minneapolis with parents and attended High School and specialized in millinery, which she worked at for eight years, then married William G. Lewis of Minneapolis and has lived there since. Lived in a suburb, St. Louis Park, when their two children were born: a daughter (died in infancy), one son, Owen Thomas.
